Diana Vu joined ACSA in 2020. Diana has worked in both the Assembly and Senate in a variety of positions, including policy consultant and legislative director. She has a broad range of experience with California government having represented many parts of the state, including the Central Valley, the Bay Area, the Central Coast, and Southern California. Through this work, Diana has become skilled at navigating the complexities of the legislative process and the impact legislation can have on the varying regions of the state.

Diana's most rewarding legislative accomplishment was the passage of AB 1995 (Chapter 407, Statutes of 2016), which requires community colleges to provide their homeless students with a basic life necessity — access to shower

facilities. In addition, Diana previously served as president of the Asian Pacific Islander Capitol Association (APICA). During her tenure, Diana strengthened and expanded APICA's Capitol internship program — doubling the number of college interns and establishing the first living wage internship program of any staff association. Diana currently serves on the APICA Advisory Board. She is a first-generation college graduate hailing from California State University, Sacramento.
